What do you do at KIWI-TEK and how long have you worked here?

I am an Inpatient Coding Auditor, I help coders with questions, focus reviews for accounts like mortality and neurological. I have been with KIWI-TEK for almost four years.

What was your first job?

When I first started in the HIM field, I worked in a business office as a Denial Specialist. I tried to resolve Insurance and Medical Necessity Denials by reviewing the records for diagnoses that were not coded, having the claim amended and rebilling or appealing said claims.

What was your biggest takeaway from COVID-19 as a medical coder?

Be prepared, things will change in order to meet the needs of the situation. Thank goodness for the "digital age."

What do you think makes KIWI-TEK different from other coding companies?
